CONFORMATION DEFECTS OR BLEMISHES

Animals will not be penalised for defects caused by injury if it can be shown they are not genetic. If a problem occurs check in box and describe if necessary on line below. Animals will be refused for registration only if conformation flaws found are SEVERE, or there are obvious genetically transmitted flaws such as bad bite or single testicle in mature animals.

Inspectors should look at the following but need only mention severe flaws. Problems from lack of care will not exclude an animal from registration provided these are being addressed by the owner.

REPRODUCTIVE (Inspector must not take risks)

If male over 24 months old both testicles descended

Poor overall balance or proportion

One or both testicles in male over 24 months old

Hair, skin in poor condition

(Comment):

Eyes, any problems (blindness due to injury will not be faulted). If animal is born with eye defects such as blind in one eye, **which might be transmitted**, this will exclude it from registration.

Ears, Nostrils or head problems

Neck, excessively ewe, short and thick or deformed.

Shoulder, withers any problems

Back, too long in proportion, excessively dipped (not a fault in older broodmares unless very extreme), loins weak or dipped (common in larger animals, severe defect if excessive).

Croup severely angled down, peaked on top, too short or narrow

Heartgirth and ribs, girth too narrow, ribs too flat, body too narrow for proportion of animal

HIND LIMBS

Cow hocks, mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe

Hind feet, do they point outward, mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe.

Hind legs set too far under body (sickle hocks), mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe.

Mention other hind limb problems if found

FORELIMBS

Fore feet turn outwards, mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe.

Fore limbs back or over at knee, mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe.

Fore limbs bowlegged or knock kneed, mild, moderate, severe, extremely severe.

Fore limbs narrow where they come out of chest, not good chest width between legs, are legs narrowly close together.

HOOF DEFECTS : Those which are caused by anything but lack of care may be considered as defects to take into account for registration purposes. Lack of care should be mentioned to the owner.

DESCRIBE ANY SEVERE TO EXTREMELY SEVERE LIMB FAULTS HERE.

PLEASE NOTE ANY SEVERE DEFECTS OR COMBINATIONS OF DEFECTS THAT YOU CONSIDER WOULD INVALIDATE THIS ANIMAL FOR REGISTRATION. We are not just looking for show animals in this inspection, just sound breeding stock without severe defects.
